The survey gathered member insights on participation, preferences, and suggestions for club improvements.


Survey Scope

37 members responded, covering topics like communication, event formats, and participation barriers.

Goal of Survey

Insights aim to enhance member engagement and improve Londoners Golf Society events experience.

MEMBER ENGAGEMENT



MEMBERSHIP & PARTICIPATION

Active Membership Engagement

Most members consider themselves active participants in the golf society, demonstrating strong dedication.

Annual Golf Play Frequency

Members typically play between 11 to 50 rounds annually, reflecting high involvement in golf.

Event Participation

Many members reported that they attended more than 10 club events in the past year, showing strong community involvement.

COMMUNICATION PREFERENCES

Preferred Communication Channels

WhatsApp and email from the TRUE handicap system are the top preferred methods for updates and event info with LINE being preferred by fewer respondents.


Clear Pre-Event Communication

Members want clearer, concise pre-event communication using bullet points or standardized formats.

Timely Information Sharing

Interest in receiving start sheets and rules via messaging apps ensures timely and accessible communication.





WEBSITE USAGE

Low Website Engagement for Active Players

Members currently show low visit frequency to the website, confirming that primary use of the platform is to attract new members and as place for the historical records of our society.

Suggested Content Enhancements

Adding start sheets, event calendars, and competition results could increase site value and member visits. But on the whole, True Handicap provides those functions.

Improved Functionality Benefits

If True Handicap provided the same functionality as the website then we could switch to just the 1 tool but both are needed for the foreseeable future.

COURSES & FIXTURES

Popular Golf Courses

Vintage Club, Flora Ville, and Subrapruek Golf Club are top preferred courses for the 2026 fixture list.

Additional Course Suggestions

Members suggested Royal Latkrabang, Bangpoo, Riverdale, and other courses for inclusion.

Variety and Freshness

Advocacy for occasional new courses aims to keep the fixture list varied and engaging.



EVENT FEES & FORMATS

Member Event Fee Preferences

Most members prefer event fees below 3,500 THB, with many favoring fees under 2,500 THB for affordability.

Preferred Competition Formats

Stableford and Medal strokeplay are the most favored formats, followed by Pairs Betterball and team events.

Single Competition Focus

Members prefer one main competition per event rather than multiple formats to enhance focus and enjoyment.

PARTICIPATION FACTORS

BARRIERS TO PARTICIPATION

Scheduling Conflicts

Many participants struggle to balance other commitments, limiting availability for events.

Event Timing Preferences

Late tee times and preference for midweek play affect attendance rates among members.

Distance and Accessibility

Distance to courses poses a significant barrier for some members attending events.

Concerns Over Event Value

Some members express concerns about prize value and pace of play impacting their participation.



MOTIVATIONS FOR PLAYING

Social Connection

Members value camaraderie and playing with friends, enhancing a positive social atmosphere.

Course Quality


The quality of the courses is a crucial factor motivating participation in events.

PRIZES & FEEDBACK

Positive Prize Feedback

Higher-Value Prizes Recommended

Suggestions included offering fewer but higher-value prizes to enhance competitiveness and reward excellence.

Cash Prizes and Achievement Recognition

A majority think cash prizes are acceptable, with calls for recognizing specific achievements like lowest gross score.

Sponsorships and Prize Quality

Recommendations included seeking sponsorships and improving the quality of technical prizes to increase value.

Appreciation for Committee Efforts

Survey shows strong appreciation for committee's organization and event planning efforts.

Willingness to Volunteer

Many members expressed readiness to volunteer or join the committee, showing engagement.

Encouraging Member Involvement

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

Member Feedback Themes

Feedback included requests for earlier tee times, more course variety, and better communication on rules and formats.

Concerns on Play Pace

Some members noted slow play issues and suggested direct actions or reminders to improve pace.

Club Appreciation and Improvement

Members expressed appreciation for club spirit and diversity while desiring continuous improvement in experience.

Communication Preferences


WhatsApp and email are the preferred communication methods among members for efficient information sharing.


Course and Format Preferences


Popular courses include The Vintage Club and Flora Ville, with Stableford and Medal formats favoured.




Members value camaraderie and well-organized events but face barriers like scheduling conflicts and late tee times.
























































YOUR COMMENTS 1

| 1 | Create WhatsApp community to have more effective ways to communicate with members than just email | Phil | | We will work on doing this more consistently. We have done it before with 1 off WhatsApp groups for each event but that didn't work fully so we will revisit e.g. using WhatsApp Communities |
| 2 | Consider other courses for 2026 | Steven | | We are using Vintage and Flora Ville as our 'Home' courses for 2026 and will rotate different courses every 3rd event. You will have noticed that nearly every course near Bangkok was suggested as a potential venue. Also that no-one said a reason they did not play was the quality of the course but that everyone said the quality of course was important. So this means the courses being chosen are of the right quality for our members. |
| 3 | Mix up the event formats in 2026 in line with the results of the survey. Avoid too many competitions running at the same event as confusing | Steven / James | Complete | We will avoid mixing different forms of competition. Events will either be individual (Stableford or Medal - mainly Stableford), or team events (e.g. Pairs, 4-Player teams). |
| 4 | Pre-Event - Try and be more clear about competition scoring | Steven | | We will continue to split the field into 3 divisions for Individual events. If one of the divisions has less than 5 players, then we will rearrange the players into 2 divisions for that event. Until now the playing handicap for individual competitions was calculated at 95%, which is recommended for competitions with 30 or more players. To avoid confusion, and align with other groups around Bangkok, we will use 100% of the Playing Handicap. |
| 5 | Let people always choose team mates in Team Comps | James | | For team events, members can choose playing partners. We are aware that this can be discouraging to newer members so we remind everyone to be welcoming. |

| 6 | Maintain course bookings that fit within the existing pricing e.g. below 3,500B in total | Steven | Complete | Noted and we will try and do this |
| 7 | Investigate some early Saturday starts for 2026 | Steven | Complete | Investigated but early starts on Saturdays increases the green fee cost beyond what was responded plus carts are mandatory even at places where walking is possible with our late morning starts. So we cannot have any early starts unfortunately |
| 8 | Improve technical prizes to at least match value of the competition match fee. | James | Complete | Noted and we will phase out the Starbucks vouchers and smaller prizes. We will work on increasing the quality of the technical prizes e.g. more sleeves of golf balls. We have also updated and shared 'The Londoner Way' key points - this is to provide more clarity on the way we run our events. |
| 9 | Consider Cash prizes | All | Complete | Although a majority responded that this was acceptable, we are not going to implement cash prizes as this time. Partly as a differentiator to other societies and partly as some committee members have very strong opinions against these and as they volunteer their time for the society they are listened to closely. |
| 10 | Pace of Play Comments | All | On-going | You can all read the comments made in the survey. Just play more promptly. Don't be the slowey - if you are unsure, ask your playing partners to rate your pace of play and react accordingly to what they say. |
| 11 | Maintain fun and friendships in the society | Phil | Complete | Yeah! Glad this was highlighted as a great thing you all value in the Londoners |

| 13 | Maintain that events are well organised | Phil | Complete | Yes, we intend to. Update for future Masters that get held over 2 Saturdays, Day 1 should be Stableford, with Strokeplay (medal) on Day 2. |
| 14 | Maintain a good committee | Phil | Complete | Of course. There will be a large refresh of the committee announced soon. |
